Destination of School Leavers

Last year the children leaving from Year 6 moved to variety of secondary schools including Pentrehafod, Bishop Gore, Olchfa, Dylan Thomas, Bishop Vaughan and Morriston.

Policies

Child Protection, Charging for School Activities, Charging and Remissions policies have been reviewed and updated.

Additional Learning Needs

The school has 5 children who have a Statement of Special Educational Needs and 78 children have been identified as having additional learning needs and are in receipt of an Individual Education Plan. Each plan is written with targets specifically set to address the child's areas of needs.

Children's progress is carefully monitored and referrals to outside agencies made wherever further advice is needed.

Agencies currently working with the school are: Speech and Language Therapists, Behaviour Support Teacher, Autistic Outreach Workers, Occupational Therapists, CAMHS, Exchange Counselling

Flying Start

Little Petals Flying Start is based in the school building and offers children from 2 years of age 2-hour sessions. The Flying Start staff liaise with the school staff to ensure transition to school is as smooth as possible and offers the child the best possible start.

Teaching and Learning

Waun Wen Primary is a caring school valuing every child. Our ethos is to make sure every child is happy, feels part of the school community and reaches their potential. The staff develop strong relationships with the children and there is a warm and welcoming atmosphere in the school which has been commented on by visitors. Mutual trust is a vital part of the relationships within the school and the staff are dedicated, enthusiastic and hard-working. All successes are celebrated, and all children are encouraged to take a full part in school life.

School Development Priorities for 2020-21

- Improve standards in English with focus on developing vocabulary and link to empathy and social communication skills. To improve outcomes for pupils in the Foundation Phase.
- Improve standards in maths and use of vocabulary. Embed bar modelling approach to teaching. To review pedagogy in mathematics teaching and evaluate current practises.
- Develop planning for the new curriculum to include new topics and address each Area of Learning Experience.
- Improve understanding of well-being and introduce Empathy Lab throughout the school. Continue to raise awareness of ASD and Trauma and support for families.
- Continue to improve the involvement of GB in self-evaluating process. To continue to develop the new curriculum and include Empathy Lab approaches.

These priorities have been determined through extensive self-evaluation. The priorities will be addressed through a variety of strategies and techniques and incorporated into a new broad, balanced curriculum. The new curriculum is shaped by the recommendations in Successful Futures the Donaldson Report and will be developed taking into account the needs of our school and our pupils.

Whilst focusing on these priorities the school is also developing the four core purposes through the planning and activities which will develop:

- Ambitious, capable learners, ready to learn throughout their lives
- Enterprising, creative contributors, ready to play a full part in life and work
- Ethical, informed citizens of Wales and the world
- Healthy, confident individuals, ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society.

These have been introduced to the pupils as 4 characters who are dragons and friends of our mascot Dylan.

Leadership:

- To continue to improve the involvement of GB in self-evaluating process.
- · To continue to develop the new curriculum and four purposes in planning

Outcomes

- To improve standards in English with focus on speech and language development in all classes
- Improve standards in maths and introduce a new maths scheme
- Raise achievement in disadvantaged youngsters (RADY project)

Provision

- Develop planning for the new curriculum to include new topics and address each Area of Learning Experience.
- Continue to develop understanding of wellbeing throughout the school and ensure it is a focal part of our curriculum
- Develop the role of the social communication champion throughout the school

Healthy Schools

Waun Wen Primary is a Healthy School and promotes healthy eating and drinking. Children in the Foundation Phase have milk and fruit daily and Key Stage 2 pupils are able to buy fruit every day. All children receive a water bottle at the beginning of the school year and are encouraged to drink water during the school day. School dinners are cooked on site and the children are also taught about healthy lifestyles during lessons.

Provision for Sport

The children have the opportunity to play a variety of sports. Last year sports offered were football, netball, gymnastics and tennis. Staff provide extra-curricular sport and clubs are always well attended.

Community Links

We have been working hard to promote the school and make it an important part of the community. We work closely with our partner primary schools and have strong transitional links with Pentrehafod Comprehensive School. Transition also is planned from Flying Start to Nursery, from Nursery to Reception and from the Foundation Phase to key stage 2.

The school also works closely with Ebenezer Church and members of the Waterfront Church visit regularly to join in Acts of Worship. There are also links with City Church in Dyfatty. Prepandemic pupils regularly visited St Mark's Nursing Home for reading and craft activities, however this has had to stop due to the restrictions. The school has strong links with Brynhyfryd Library and the Community PCSO visits the school regularly and supports activities in the community.

Welsh Language

No children currently attending this school come from a Welsh speaking home. Welsh is taught as a second language throughout the school and on a daily basis.

The Cylch Cymraeg are involved in the Siarter laith and promote the speaking of Welsh around the school.

Toilet Facilities

The children have access to adequate toilet facilities which are cleaned on a daily basis. The toilets in most areas of the building need updating and plans are being made to carry out these changes as soon as enough money becomes available. The first toilets to be updated were the infant boys' toilets. Junior girls have been identified as the next priority.

Message from the Chair of Governors

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the parents for their continued support throughout a difficult year.

During the lockdowns the school provided continued support to its children and their families. It was an Emergency Childcare Hub providing childcare for key worker families and vulnerable children. The staff also delivered food parcels and resources to the children liaising with community support to ensure the most needy families were not forgotten. I know that so many of you appreciated this support and I offer my thanks to the staff for their commitment to the school throughout this difficult year.

The partnership between home and school is vital for any child to succeed and the support that you, as parents show, helps to make this school such a lovely place for everyone.
